Parlor: From Shark Bite to Bear Hug: Who are you in Conflict? Come discover your conflict style handling mode with a free Thomas Kilman assessment being offered. Shining a light on personal conflict management helps to illuminate the path to discovering how others are navigating the dispute. We can use conflict as an opportunity to evaluate, reflect, be curious, and cast a new vision. Parlor: Trauma-Informed Ministry for Youth and Kids: You don't have to look far to know that the news is not good. Kids are in crisis and experiencing unprecedented levels of anxiety and depression driven by trauma. The statistics are terrifying- one in four girls and one in six boys are sexually abused before the age of 18. More than one in seven children experience physical abuse in their homes. What is the church to do in the face of those odds? This workshop will provide an introduction to the impact of trauma on child development, emotions, and behavior and will offer practical strategies for how to enter into that suffering, create a supportive environment, and address some of the behavioral and emotional challenges that arise because of trauma exposure and chronic stress. These strategies will be applicable across congregational contexts- whether intergenerational settings or age-specific ministries.
