My name is Karen Sutton. I have been a follower of Jesus Christ since 1974. Very soon after being baptized as a new Christian, I was called to work with children in the teaching ministry at the church I attended. Since that time my passion has been to teach and share the gospel of Jesus Christ in many different settings and with different age groups. Sewing Seams for a Cause was established in 2018 when I became aware of the need for comfort items for breast cancer patients. Not being much of a sewer, I really did not know if I would be of much use, but I learned early on that if God was calling, He would equip. So, with my granddaughter we started to sew and this ministry was born. The ministry has grown and spread God's comfort and His plan for salvation to many who have breast cancer. I consider being a part of Sewing Seams for a Cause as one of the greatest blessings of my life.

Hi! My name is Laurie Arria. I have been a Christian all my life. I was raised catholic and converted to the Nazarene denomination in 2013. My love for sewing started at an early age when I completed my girl scout sewing badge. Over the years, as many of my family and friends were plagued by cancer, I became passionate about raising money for cancer research, reaching out to families who were struggling with watching a loved one suffer and to the patients that were inflicted with the pain and suffering associated with cancer. In 2018 when I had the opportunity to make comfort care items for patients of this dreadful disease, I saw it as a chance to utilize my love for sewing, fulfill passion for helping people plagued with cancer and to help to spread the word of God to people who were at a point in their life where they truly needed him to walk with them. This ministry has blessed me in so many ways and I am so grateful to be a part of it.

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Youth Ministry 101: No Resources? No Problem!

Ministry to teens doesn't require fancy equipment, giant spaces, or million dollar budgets. (It doesn't even require a youth pastor, but don't tell my boss that!) In this workshop we will not only talk about what it looks like to connect with today's students, but how you can do it with small spaces, simple supplies, and a shoestring budget. You will leave this workshop with resources, ideas and encouragement. Ideal for both those who work with youth and those who are praying for a fledgling youth ministry to begin.

Pastor Carey is a wife, mom, and ordained elder in the Nazarene Church. She currently serves as the Pastor to Students and their Families at Rochester Calvary where she has been for 8 years. Prior to her time in pastoral ministry she worked as a middle school teacher in the public school system and both callings have given her the opportunity to observe the incredible passion and potential in this next generation. As an advocate of holistic family ministry, she is passionate about the faith formation and leadership development of students as well as the equipping of those ministering to them. To this end she has participated in the development of a wide variety of curriculum and teen devotionals as well as youth safety and ministry policies. She is the Upstate NYC coordinator, a former camp director, and sits on the Stakeholders Board of her local school system. Cultivating Daily Wellbeing:Patterns and Practices

This training invites participants to learn both why a Rule of Life or Plan to Flourish is necessary AND how to develop one. Participants will be introduced to the Flourishing in Ministry research findings with particular focus on daily wellbeing as viewed through the lenses of relationships, rhythms, responsibilities, and rest. A final step will help participants take meaningful steps toward developing and implementing daily patterns and practices.

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Grace Mapping:Forming New Communities of Faith



Are you feeling called to start a new outreach ministry or perhaps embark on a new church plant in your community? Drawing from nearly three decades of experience in participating in and supporting church planting endeavors, we've discerned a consistent pattern in how this process unfolds. Our insights and observations have coalesced into what we term 'Grace Mapping.' Essentially, Grace Mapping is the synergy of the people of God cooperating with the progressive grace of God to establish new communities of faith through intentional presence and prayer. It serves as a practical framework for discussions centered around identifying and actively joining in God's work of reaching communities or specific people groups. We invite you to engage in this conversation as we explore how to discern and participate in God's grace at work in our midst.

Pastor Jay Sunberg

Dr. Jay Sunberg and his wife Teanna have dedicated nearly three decades to missionary work for the Church of the Nazarene, spanning various cultures and countries including Moscow, Russia; Sofia, Bulgaria; Budapest, Hungary; and Poznań, Poland. Dr. Sunberg served as the Central Europe Field Strategy Coordinator for 15 years, overseeing church expansion across 12 nations and establishing new works in three. Dr. Filimão Chambo

Dr. Filimão Chambo is a General Superintendent in the Church of the Nazarene. He grew up in Mozambique, where both of his parents served in full-time ministry for the Church of the Nazarene. Before his election as the 42nd general superintendent in 2017, he earned an MA in Biblical Studies in 2000 and a Ph.D. in Biblical Studies in 2009 from the University of Johannesburg. He has pastored churches in South Africa and Mozambique, and was an educator at NTC-South Africa and at Seminário Nazareno em Mozambique, where he later became the seminary president. He served as the Africa Education Coordinator, and was then elected Africa Regional Director. As Regional Director, he was responsible for overseeing the church planting and development efforts of the Church of the Nazarene across Africa. Dr. Chambo is married to Dr. Samantha Chambo, who is also an ordained elder, and is the current Education Coordinator for the USA/Canada region for the Church of the Nazarene. They have two children, a daughter, Tsakani Gabriella, and a son, Emanuel.



Spiritual Conversations with People Far From God
